The role of the Junior Leadership Team

- To be a responsible, reliable and trustworthy role model within the school.
- To assist the Lead Learning Mentor and school staff in duties at Play times and lunch times.
- To assist in Homework Club by supporting the children to complete their work
- To run the reading corner by reading books, listening to the children read and helping them enjoy reading.
- To deliver playtime games on the playground to encourage children to play together.
- To assist children by being a buddy to find and build friendships with their peers.
- To encourage other children in the school by being good role models by setting examples of good behaviour, being kind and caring, being friendly and being the best, they can be in their learning.
- To become a mentor to other children who may be struggling in school socially and help build their confidence.
- To uphold the school values at all times

- To have good attitude to school and their learning by showing there are putting their best effort into their work.
