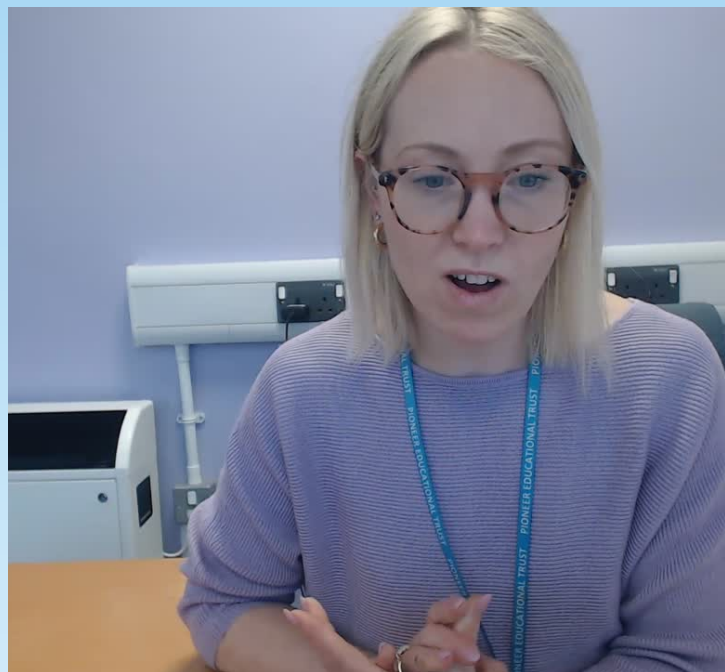
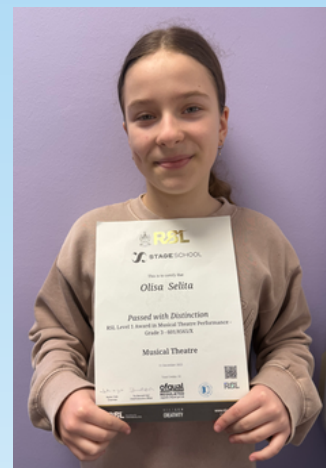

Earlier this month, on 4th February, the school closed at 1:15pm to allow time for our face-to-face Parent Consultation meetings. These meetings gave families and teachers the opportunity to discuss pupil progress, celebrate achievements, and agree next steps for learning. We appreciate the strong turnout and the positive conversations that took place.

On 5th February, we continued Parent Consultations by phone for families who were unable to attend in person. This ensured that all parents and carers had the chance to speak with their child's teacher and remain fully informed about progress and support. The After School Club booking link for Spring Term 2 was shared with all parents on 9th February. This allowed families to review the available clubs and secure places for their children in advance of the new half term.

The booking link then closed at midday on 11th February. Closing the form at this time enabled staff to finalise registers, organise staffing, and prepare resources for each club so that sessions can run smoothly from the start of term.

This session will explain how phonics is taught in school and provide practical ideas to help support reading at home. Parents and carers are warmly encouraged to attend.

Here are our Dream Birds:

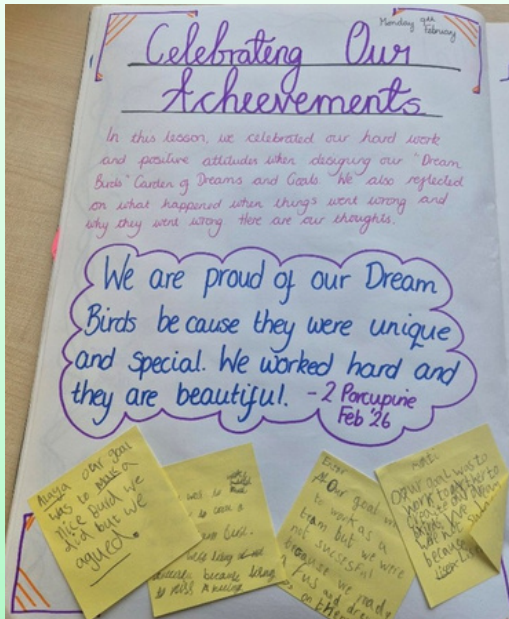

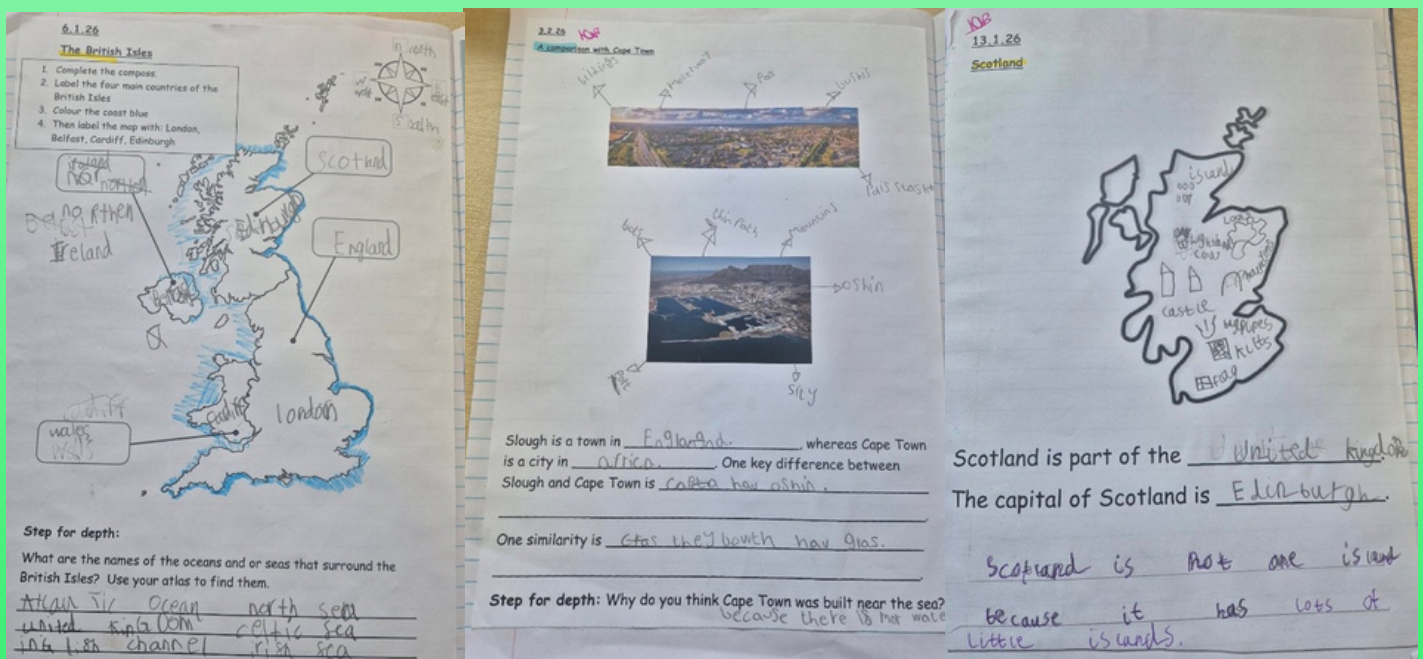

We also had to work hard on our understanding of the difference between 'island' and 'Ireland' which can be a bit of a tongue twister. Our favourite facts included learning about The Highland Cows in Scotland; The Irish dancing and Gaelic football in Ireland; the lighthouses and shipwrecks in Wales; and the differences each country have to England. We also compared The British Isles to Cape Town in Africa and marvelled at the differences and similarities between each place.
