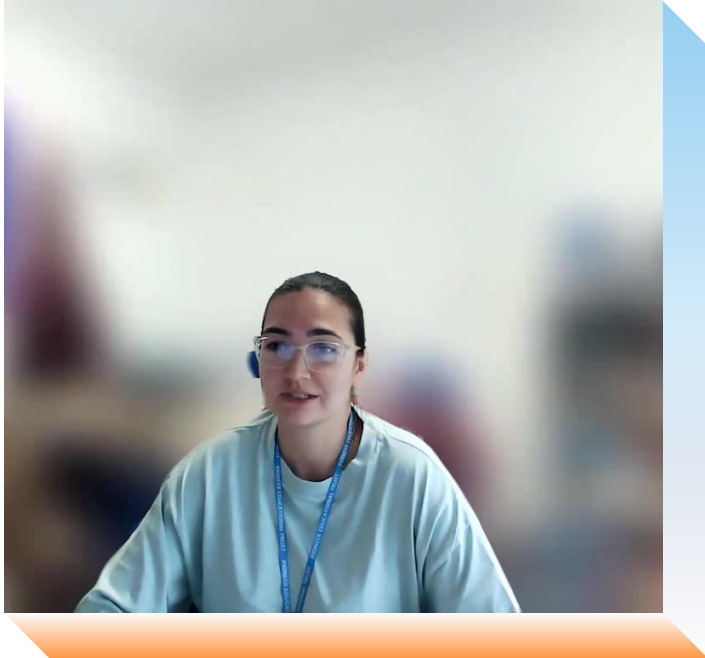


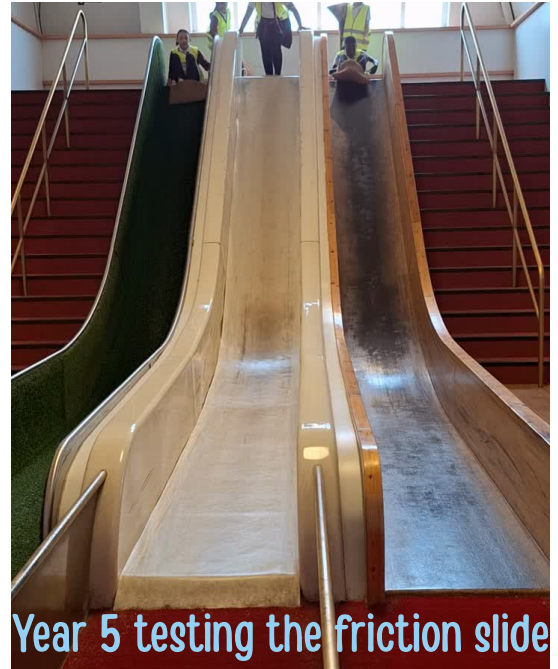


OFFICIAL NEWSLETTER

Nursery



Nursery's topic this term is Heroes and Adventures. So far, the children have been learning about Valentina Tereshkova, a pioneering astronaut who inspired generations with her courage and determination. Inspired by her amazing journey, the children explored space through creative play and hands-on learning. They designed and built their own rockets using a variety of materials, construction resources, and toys, carefully testing their ideas and sharing their imaginative space adventures with friends. The topic has sparked great curiosity, creativity, and excitement as the children continue their heroic adventures through learning and play.



The children also enjoyed drawing and designing rockets using pens and chalk, creating colourful space scenes filled with planets, stars, and galaxies. Through their artwork, they used their imaginations to build exciting space environments and bring their adventurous ideas to life.

The books we have enjoyed so far this term are Elmer and Super El and Superworm. Inspired by these stories, the children have shown growing independence and creativity through a range of activities. They loved dressing up as superheroes, taking on exciting roles and adventures with their friends. They also created colourful patchwork elephants using chalk and tissue paper, carefully selecting colours and materials to make their own unique versions of Elmer. These activities have helped to develop their imagination, confidence, and fine motor skills while bringing the stories to life.

Reception



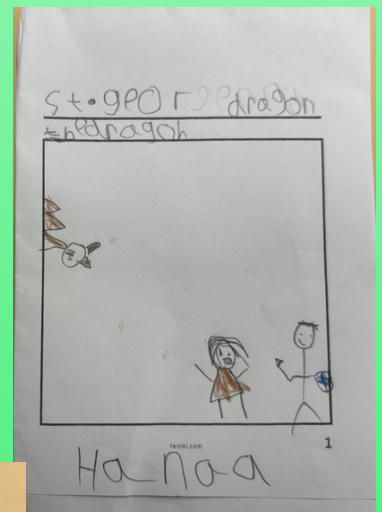
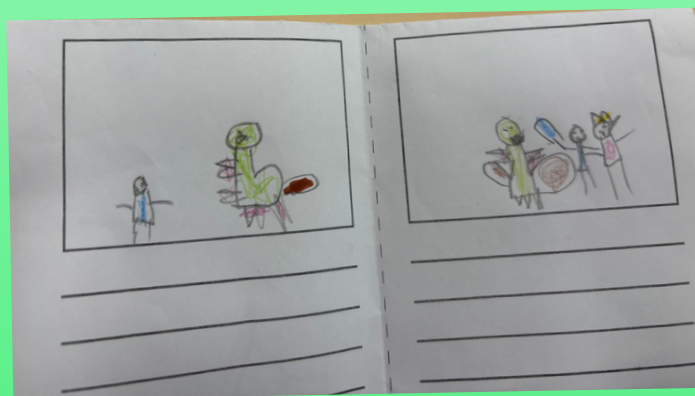
In Reception, we are learning about Stories from the Past as part of the Primary Knowledge Curriculum (PKC). This week, we have been looking at legends and the story of St George and the Dragon.

The children created a dragon collage for their display using tissue paper. They enjoyed exploring colour and texture and collaborating to bring their artwork to life.

We discussed the story, thinking about the characters, the problem in the story and how it was resolved. The children explored the meaning of bravery and shared examples of times when they have shown courage themselves.

Inspired by the story, the children created their own books and became storytellers. They carefully thought about what should happen on each page including the beginning, middle and end of their stories.

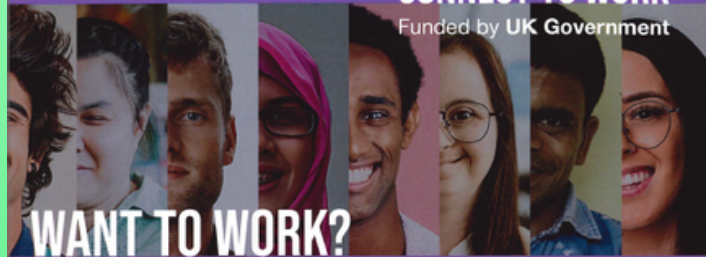
