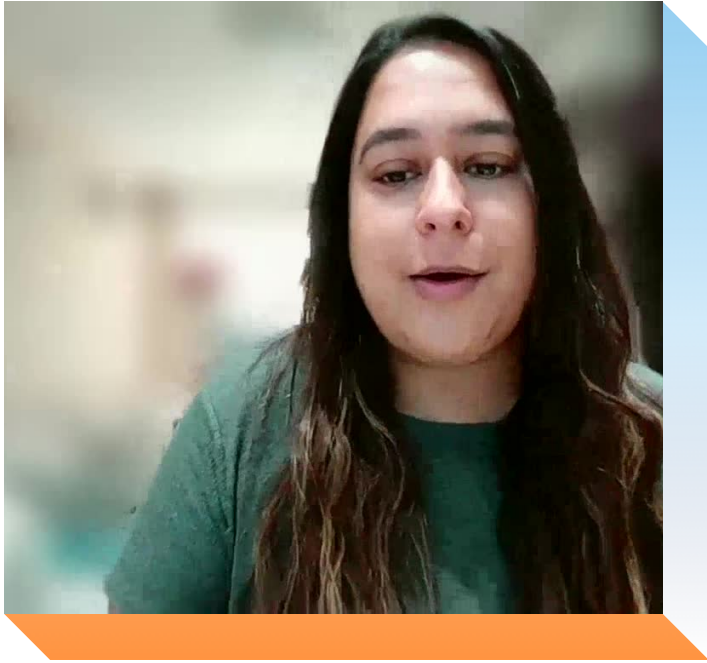

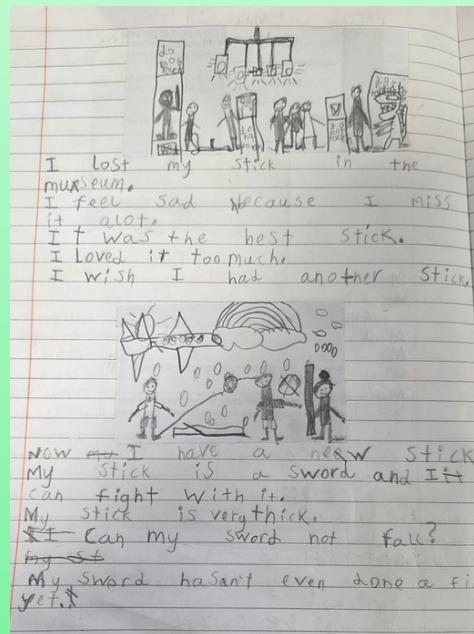
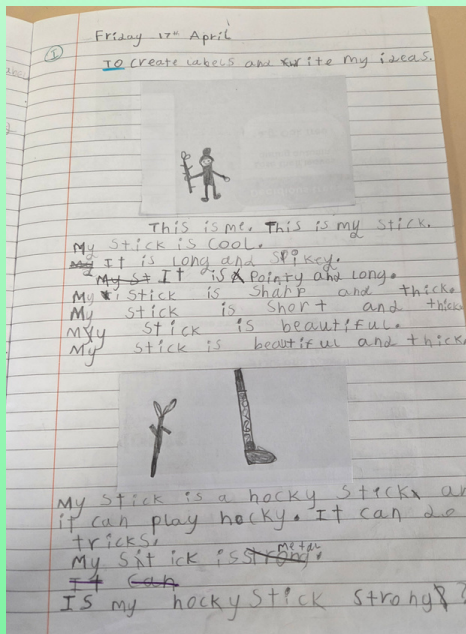
1 Hedgehog

Spreading Kindness in Our Community

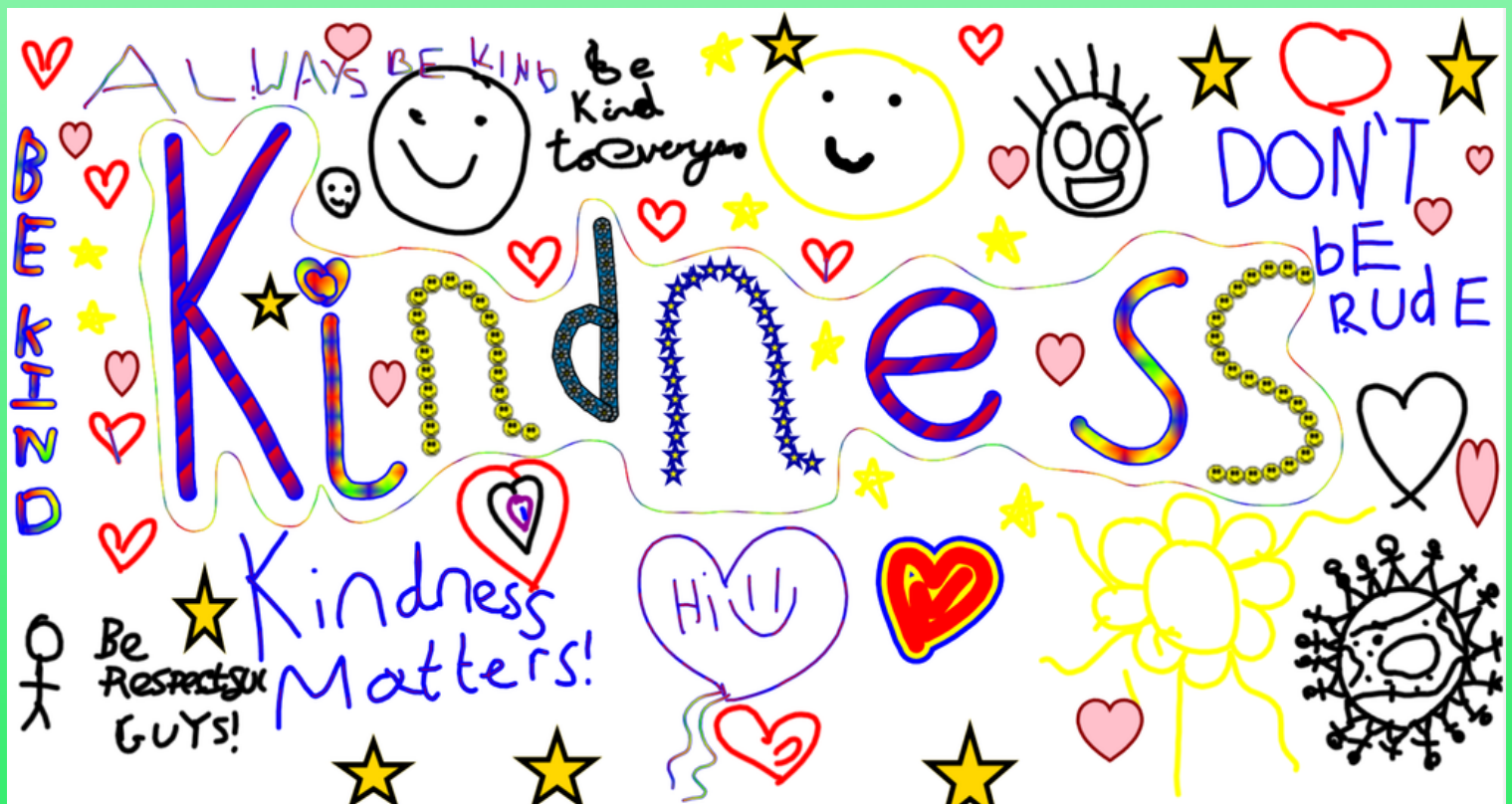

Together, we believe that small acts of kindness can create big change. What have you done today to make a difference?



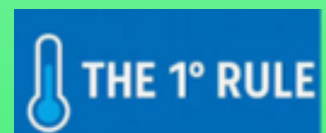
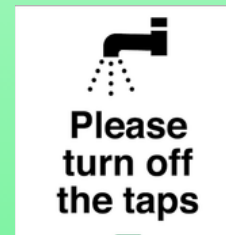
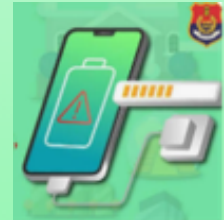
Y6 ROCK Project



A significant part of our ROCK project involved researching ways to save electricity. The research team (Lakshaya, Mumin, Myah and Jayden Singh) have put together the tips below. This is one of our contributions to raising awareness about how we can all reduce energy use.

Tips to Save Electricity – Every Little Helps! 😊

- Use natural light wherever possible. It helps save money, keeps your energy bills low, and can even slightly warm your home.
- Avoid leaving devices charging unattended. This can be a safety hazard and also wastes electricity.
- Turn off taps when not in use, especially if they have heated water. This helps reduce energy bills and prevents water waste.
- Use whiteboards instead of smartboards when you can. They do the same job but use no electricity.
- Lower your heating by just 2°C. Over a year, this could save between £160 and £260 – that's a lot of money!
- Set your washing machine to 30°C. Washing at a lower temperature can reduce your energy bill significantly.

Top Tips for Staying Safe in the Heatwave ☀️

With this lovely burst of sunshine, we're all enjoying the brighter days—but we also know how tiring and uncomfortable the heat can be for little ones (and grown-ups too!). Here are my top tips to help your child stay happy, cool, and comfortable:

💧 Keep them well hydrated

A good drink before school and a clearly named water bottle in their bag really makes a difference. We'll keep encouraging regular drinks throughout the day.

🧢 Don't forget hats and sunscreen

Applying sunscreen before school helps set them up for the day, and a hat they're happy to wear gives that extra protection when they're outside.

👕 Dress for comfort

Light, breathable clothing will help your child stay cool and comfortable, especially during busy school days.

😓 Expect a slower pace

You might notice your child is a little more tired than usual—this is completely normal. Slower evenings, some quiet time, and plenty of rest can really help.

⚠️ Know the signs

If your child seems flushed, dizzy, or unusually tired, it's a sign they may be too hot. A cool space, a drink, and some rest usually help them recover quickly.
